## **Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy**

Title	CBRC Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy
THE	Conte China Juricty and Weindeling Fulley
Purpose	This policy is intended to outline the CBRC commitment to ensuring that all children and young people who visit, participate, and engage with the activities of this club are kept safe and free from harm.  The policy also intends to support awareness and practices for all members, volunteers and visitors of the rowing club, of the standards that apply in maintaining a safe environment for children and young people.
Statement of Commitment	The CBRC will not tolerate any harm, abuse or neglect of any child and will actively ensure the child safe standards are an intrinsic component of its operations and values.
Scope	This policy applies to all members, visitors, volunteers, contractors who work directly with children or who may encounter children through the course of their engagement with the club.
Responsibilities	• The committee will oversee the implementation of the policy and ensure that all members understand the requirements of the Child Safe Standards in practice. The committee will also ensure that those members who work directly with children have undertaken the required training. The committee will ensure that all nominated members have a current Working with Children's Check and will maintain a register for the above to comply with legislation. The committee will review this policy and the associated practices on an annual basis or as otherwise directed by RV. The committee will lead the club in ensuring a safe environment is maintained for children that is free from harm and abuse.  Members  • All CBRC members will be familiar with the practices associated with creating a safe environment for children and will comply with this policy and the directions of Rowing Victoria and legislation. Members will be required to acknowledge their understanding of this policy and the associated practices at the annual membership renewal.  Coaching staff  • All coaching staff who are directly involved with children through the course of their activities within the club will have a current WWCC and will complete the required Child Safe training.
